We're changing to evening recycling from September

In response to your requests, we have successfully re-negotiated our recycling contract to collect all your recycling in the evening.

This will not only keep the streets clean and tidy for your customers during the day, but will also mean those bars and restaurants who open later can benefit too. And best of all it frees up our cheery recycling team during the day to be the Angel Ambassadors you want them to be.

Rhys, Damion and Ash will be giving a warm welcome to visitors, and pointing clients in the direction of your business, they'll be telling everyone what's on offer. We're making best use of their local knowledge so they'll also be keeping an eye on security at the Angel, and reporting environmental issues such as dumped rubbish. It's a WIN WIN!

The important thing is that every business is aware of your new recycling times. Islington Council will be collecting all of your recycling but you will still use our bags and stickers and put everything out in the same place as you do now. The new scheme starts in September and we will contact you soon to confirm the exact times.

The council is also changing the times it collects business waste. Don't get caught out and fined – keep checking the signs they are putting up on lamp posts and their website for updates https://beta.islington.gov.uk/business/business-waste

We will be asking all angel. london businesses to re-elect us for the third term of our business improvement district so we can continue all the services that you've told us benefit your business.

In order that you can have your say, we need to know who in your organisation takes the vote. For local businesses it will be the owner or ratepayer, for chains and larger organisations it will be the person in charge of the property portfolio, asset manager or managing director.

We need their contact details urgently so we can send out voting papers. The ballot is throughout October.

Look out for our Renewal Proposal 2017-2022 which contains details of everything we do, and all the new services we shall be offering on top.

You can't get enough of a good thing

Businesses outside the BID area are regularly asking if they can be part of it and benefit from our services so we have decided to extend the area at re-election, which is the only chance to change the boundary.

In order to increase our income to plough back into services and swell our critical mass for marketing and promoting the Angel, we be extending in three directions – north along Upper Street to Islington Town Hall, along Essex Road to Gaskin Street and Pentonville Road to Penton Street.

At least 20 businesses in these areas have already joined as voluntary members, paying the BID levy and receiving our services.

The sun shone, the community turned out, and businesses showed their appreciation at the borough's Armed Forces Day on Islington Green.

Two angel.london businesses responded to our appeal for support and did themselves proud.

"We are eager to be part of the community," said Claire O'Sullivan, manager of French brasserie **Bellanger** which opened six months ago and served tea, coffee and cakes to the war vets and their families. "It's lovely to recognise people coming in to dine, and in turn make our contribution to the area."

And this is the fifth year our local branch of **Waitrose** has responded to the call for Armed Forces Day support by donating 100 roses for war vets' families and friends and local councillors to lay at the war memorial

"It's marvellous to see our local businesses putting back into the community. It makes such a difference," said Islington South and Finsbury MP Emily Thornberry who laid a wreath at the memorial ceremony. "It's important everyone acknowledges what the armed forces are doing to keep us all safe."

When is A-Board not allowed?

We know many businesses are confused by the rules and regs surrounding A-boards, especially after receiving zero-tolerance letters from TfL recently. So-we've asked our expert contacts in Islington Council to outline their policy clearly.

The short version - nothing is allowed on TfL red routes unless you can prove the land outside your business is yours. TfL have given Islington Council the power to licence tables and chairs on the red routes. A-boards and tables and chairs are decided by the council on all other streets, but on a case by case basis.

On camera

After two years of campaigning our two new CCTV cameras have been installed and switched on in Upper Street - and they are already delivering results.

Recently a local bank alerted police they suspected two people were committing fraud in the branch. The council's CCTV control room heard the call, quickly refocused the cameras, and in seconds spotted the pair emerging from the bank. The camera operator tracked one of the suspects to a local coffee shop and directed the police, who then made an arrest. This is a perfect example of how CCTV can enhance the work of our angel.london Police Team. Do make sure you report everything that's happening.



If it happens, REPORT IT!

We're asking all businesses to report any crimes that happen in and around their premises so we can build up a clear picture of what's going on at the Angel.

Even if you're too busy at the time, please call 101 afterwards and report the incident.

Businesses in Camden Passage have been asking for CCTV after recent robberies, and in order to campaign for extra cameras, it's important to show there's a need.

As well as identifying criminals for a specific crime, CCTV footage is very helpful to police investigations because offenders do repeat their crimes on the same day in the same area. Thieves or muggers operating here are often known to the angel.london Police Team already and if they can be charged with a number of offences, they are more likely to be given a custodial sentence and removed from our streets.

"Make sure your business is equipped with the best CCTV you can afford, that it's in the best possible condition, and that your staff know how to use it," says angel.london Police Team Sergeant Chris Walsh. "There's nothing worse than having blurry unusable images that we know could be evidence if only we could see them."

We are offering BID levy payers the services of police experts advising you where best to site your CCTV cameras if you are putting them in.

This year alone the police team have convicted more than 40 bag thieves, pickpockets and shoplifters by identifying them from CCTV images. They could catch a lot more....



Better air

We've already made great progress towards cleaner air - by signing up 270 BID businesses to our Angel-wide free recycling we're reducing waste-related traffic by six lorries a day. That means less pollution and less congestion.

We are keeping an eye on air quality here because the more popular the Angel gets, the more traffic and people are attracted here. We estimate there are currently 12,000 office and shop workers employed locally, not to mention residents.

We are also making you aware that from 2020 the Angel will be part of London's new Ultra Low Emissions Zone to improve air quality and the health of everyone living and working in London. It will operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week in the current congestion zone. We will keep you posted...

Get your spoke in for a cycling grant Transport for London (TfL) is calling all community groups and notfor-profit organisations to apply for cycling grants, which will equip them to help more people from more backgrounds to cycle more safely. The next funding round opens on 1 August and closes on 19 September 2016. Cycling Grants London (CGL) helps to fund cycle training, bike maintenance courses and guided rides. It's funded by TfL and managed by the environmental regeneration charity, Groundwork London. Up to 24 new projects run by organisations such as residents' associations, charities and youth groups will receive funding in this round. Organisations can apply for up to £10,000 over a three-year period. More info on how to apply at www.cyclinggrants.london
